Supports may include, but are not limited to:

- Referral to counseling, medical, and/or other healthcare services
- Referral to the employee assistance program
- Referral to community-based service providers
- · Visa and immigration assistance
- Student financial aid counseling
- Education to the University of Arizona community or community subgroup(s)
- Altering campus housing assignment(s)
- Safety planning
- Providing safety escorts through SafeRide
- Providing transportation accommodations
- Implementing contact limitations (no contact orders) between the parties
- Academic support, extensions of deadlines, or other course/program-related adjustments
- Exclusionary instructions
- Class schedule modifications, withdrawals, or leaves of absence
- Increased security and monitoring of certain areas of the campus

LEGAL PROTECTIVE ORDERS

Injunctions Against Harassment in Arizona can be initiated at <u>azpoint.azcourts.gov</u>. This website also provides information on process steps, information on courts throughout Arizona, and on community-based advocates.

Tribal Protective Orders may be available through courts which administer justice systems of Native Nations/tribal nations. Each tribal court may utilize a specific process; individuals seeking tribal protective orders should contact the tribal court directly. ADMINISTRATIVE NO CONTACT ORDERS

No Contact Orders are issued by the Office of Institutional Equity and the Dean of Students Office. These orders are administrative and are generally non-disciplinary and mutually binding. The orders are issued to students and may be issued in all instances where the university may exert disciplinary authority.
